The Youth Outreach Empowerment Team (YOET) CYMH brings together a dedicated group of professionals committed to supporting youth in care at high risk. As part of this specialized team, you collaborate with social workers, youth advocates, Indigenous Elders, and other community partners to provide flexible, creative, and client-centered mental health services. This team thrives on collaboration, meeting youth where they are and helping them build connections that foster healing and growth. Your work directly impacts young people who may struggle to access traditional services, making a lasting difference in their lives.

As a YOET Outreach Clinician for Youth at High Risk, you provide life-changing support to youth in care who face significant risks and barriers. You meet them where they are, building trust, connecting them with essential services, and helping them navigate the transition to adulthood. Many youths served by YOET thrive because of the care and advocacy this role provides.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Masters in Counselling, Social Work, Educational Counselling, Clinical Counselling, Clinical Psychology or Child and Youth Care or comparable graduate degree at the Master's level in a similar subject may be considered.
 - NOTE: If your degree was obtained outside of Canada, you need to confirm it has been assessed for equivalency through the International Credential Evaluation Services (ICES). You must provide a basic report by the closing date of this posting to be considered.
- Experience in clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology.
- Minimum of one year full-time equivalent experience working with children and youth and their families, with responsibility for providing a wide range of community based mental health services
- Must possess and maintain a valid class 5 BC Driver's license with no restriction or equivalent (i.e. from another Canadian Province).
