Job Summary:

The Counsellor works in our Sexual Abuse Intervention Program (SAIP) counselling for children/youth 4 to 18 years old who have experienced sexual abuse, assault, or exploitation. This position provides intake, assessment, individual service plans, individual and group counselling, brief and ongoing sessions, and provides clients with information about other relevant services. The Counsellor assists clients in addressing trauma and working toward identified goals.

Your Role:

Archway's Counsellor with the Montrose Wellness and Trauma Counselling Program contributes by:

- Providing one-on-one counselling, in person or virtually, that may include psychoeducation, crisis support/referral, play therapy and other trauma counselling as is appropriate for the client(s).
- Gathering information about the client, conducting assessments, and identifying areas of concern.
- Developing interpretive summaries and consulting with each client to create individualized service plans.
- Working collaboratively with families and support services for clients.
- Providing opportunities for group facilitation with caregivers.
